Multiplier Event UK

edEducation is co-organising a professional networking event on 12th April 2019 at Carlton Towers, North Yorkshire, bringing together adult training institutions and business representatives from the North of England. The aim is to explore together the potential impact of training mature adults online on local businesses and the economy in general. The representatives of different training organisations will discuss how the training provision to mature adults can be improved using the TAO approach, while representatives of businesses will encourage an increased share of the silver generation in online business as a result of their improved digital inclusion.

Using the results of the TAO project we would like to get into an exchange with them about the digital competences of educators and mature learners. Fourth transnational meeting in Schwerin, Germany

The final transnational meeting of the TAO project took place in Schwerin on 4th and 5th of February 2019. During the meeting the partnership tested the app in detail, collected feedback and reported bugs. Furthermore, the partners discussed different ways to deliver training using resources developed within the project in order to give differentiated advice in the program of training. Throughout the meeting the partners also reached an agreement about the layout of the guide. Other topics on the agenda were the overall project management and reporting, evaluation and ongoing dissemination, which also included the planning of the multiplier events in the partner countries.



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
